The contest season is fully upon us. Many individuals and groups were on for the CQWW contests. The hottest competition was in the CQWW CW. N6ND's station and crew has a claimed score of 7.9 million. The crew at N6DX is claiming 7.7 million. Upon further inspection of the logs, Darrell, N6DX says that the has found some more multipliers. Who knows how it will turn out?

As usual, the SCCC was well represented world wide by our members in the CQWW CW. Our SCCC travelers included: N6ZZ at SU1RR, N6AA at TU4B, N6TJ at D44BC, K6NA at 9Y4H and WA6OTU at HC8U. Out of the area member, Dave Hodges, AA6RX, was part of the KY1H M/M effort, (hope you can bring back some of their contest secrets). Scores and operations are listed elsewhere. Please sent in your scores no matter how small. If all the Club members that we know who were active send in their logs and credit the SCCC, we could have a very formidable score.

The CQWW Phone is also history with a good efforts in the m/m category by N6DX and N6ND. Other contests with active SCCC efforts include the CQ 160, with: K6LL, N6VR, NI6W, N6ND, WA7ZTN, KA6SAR, N6TR and KV0I. The ARRL 10m contest will have a good M/M effort from Rainbow Ridge, don't know what call they used.

Would like to mention that our youngest member, Darrel Craig Jr is now KK6BB, ex KB6RXF. Also would like to welcome W6TKV who attended our last meeting at the QTH of N6AA. Hope you'll attend more meetings and join our team.

Please look at your address label on this issue of the SCCCORE. Seems we're having a hard time getting some of the members to renew. Enclosed elsewhere is a list of those ex-members recently dropped from the SCCC roles, and those with expired dues. When you renew, I'd suggest you sign up for two years at only \$8 dollars. That way you aren't hassled every year, and creates less paperwork for the Sec/Treasurer. We don't want to accept dues for more than two years since if we have a dues increase, we'd be carrying people at the old rates for possibly two years or more.

The DX PacketCluster is up and running quite well. New nodes are N6CDA - Palms Springs and desert areas, and N6VR

- Oxnard/Ventura areas and North. We're trying to improve the backbone link to the San Diego area, and hope to make a connection to the Santa Maria node. During both modes of the CQWW, as well as the CQ160 contests, a large number of announcements were passed through the packet system. I'm sure that a lot of guys were able to increase their scores, and likewise the score at the DX station thru the use of the DX Packet. Do remember that if you used the DX Packet during the contest, you're now in the single operator unlimited category. When your local node operator puts out a request for help, make a real attempt to see if you can help. There's a lot to keep a node going and any help is greatly appreciated.

Finally, elections are this month. Enclosed in this issue is a tear-out, self addressed page for you to cast your absentee ballot. Ballots will be accepted by mail and also gathered at the SCCC meeting on Dec 30 after the TRW Swapmeet. Announcement of new officers will be made at the meeting. Location of the meeting is elsewhere in the SCCORE. Luigi's is closed until Feb, 1990 due to freeway construction.

That's it for now. I hope to keep supplying input to the SCCCORE since I know how difficult it can be on the Editor to gather enough info to keep the bulletin full. Some of you should also consider contributing to the SCCCORE too!

HAM RADIO SOFTWARE

What's out there in the way of software relating to HAM Radio? Well, the answer to that question is TONS! I will, over the next several issues of SCCCORE, give you a list of the packages I've been able to find.

The following list of programs are diverse but should give you an indication of just some of the packages available to assist you with HAM radio applications that you might have. I will try and concentrate primarily on antennae design, data-base, and contest packages.

IBM OR COMPATABLE SOFTWARE

DXLOG-DXCC data base manager..Featuring logging, printing QSL's, need lists, status reports, notification when a new DXCC or WAZ level have been reached, and automated production of the DXCC and WAZ submission forms. (\$39.95 from PAYL Software, BOX 926, Levittown, PA. 19057)

MN 2.00 & YO 2.00- Antenna design software...MN 2.0 analyzes free-space antennas, compute forward gain, F/B, beamwidth, sidelobes, current, impedance, SWR, take-off angle, and patterns with lots more features and power..YO 2.0 is a yagi designer program, offering yagi designs with features such as auto adjustment of element lengths & spacing for max forward gain, max F/B, and minimum SWR, includes models for gamma, T, hairpin, and beta matches, element tapering, mounting plates and frequence scaling.
