SCCC Announces Big Plans For The 1991 CQ Worldwide DX Contest by Jim Neiger, N6TJ

In the 1989 CW CQ Worldwide DX Contest, the Southern California Contest Club entered it s first Team for the then new Team Competition in the contest. It was a Team of 5 SCCC members, all of whom operated in the Single-Operator All Band category, and all were outside North America. Again in 1990, the SCCC formed two 5-man entries with excellent results. Six of our ops ended up in the Top Ten (world), and all 10 were in the Top Twenty. Our Teams placed No. 1 and No. 2. This year, we're expanding our efforts and our goal is to mount at least four SCCC Teams. Thus far, probable All-Band operations include AH3C at ISOQDV, N6AA at 4S7EA, N6ZZ at 7Q7LA, W6NV at CT4NH, N6ZV at D68GA, N6RJ at ZF2JR, N6TJ at D44BC, CT1BOH at HC5K, N6TR at TI2CF, N6CW at KP2A, WN4KKN at ZP0Y, and WA6OTU at XE2MX. Other operators committed to All-Band operations from DX locations yet to be established are: W6XD, XE1/AA6RX, K9VV, and AE6E.

mini-sprint at the start of the contest, in which we devote the first 25 minutes to working fellow SCCC Team members (ONLY!) on All-Bands besides 160 meters. It has proven to be a real challenge, alot of fun, and the chance to work many multipliers in a very short time. Last year's winner of this mini-sprint was N6TJ, working 39 Qs in 39 countries in 25 minutes. This year there will be at least 95 band-countries possible in this 25 minute period. Team members are restricted to single operators, preferably All-Band entries, and preferably from DX locations for obvious reasons. However, this year we will attempt to accomodate single-band entries from DX locations and Stateside All-Band entries if there is sufficient interest. Also, if there is enough interest, we will mount a team for SSB as well.

A major advantage of being on an SCCC Team is the opportunity to participate in the Those interested in being on an SCCC Team should call **Jim Neiger** at (213) 649-3477 (days). Call as soon as you can, because time is running out to plan it.

Contest Advisory Committee Report from Kurt, NI6W

Contrary to common folklore, the S.W. Division Rep. has not retired from contesting. He has been trapped in a time warp created by disruption of the space-time continuum. This anomaly is similar in nature to the solar disturbances we experience in Radioland. Current measurements indicate the time warp indices will be returning to near normal levels. During the last year, I have been asked to present "Contest Programs" at several non-contest club meetings. These have been a lot of fun and were well recieved. Rich has done an excellent job as CAC chairman, and provided complete coverage of CAC activities in his column.

Discussion of the last CAC ballot are in the July/August NCJ. This ballot was mostly directed at weeding out the dead issues in preparation for the next ballot. The vote did result in a consensus on 3 items. Two were accepted by ARRL Awards Committee. A new rover category and four band multi-op class are now available in the UHF contest. The SS Plaque Awards recommendation was put off till 1992.

WA6PMX, Sw. Div. VUAC Rep. has recently submitted proposals for the UHF Contest increasing QSO points for microwave contacts and Field Day requesting bonus point status for ATV with QSO point credit. Barring considerable negative comment, I intend to support both proposals. The CAC is primarily comprised of HF contesters and hence, requires as much available input from the RTTY, EME, and VHF/UHF communities. Anyone into VHF/UHF contesting should follow W3EP's column in NCJ and PLEASE forward
